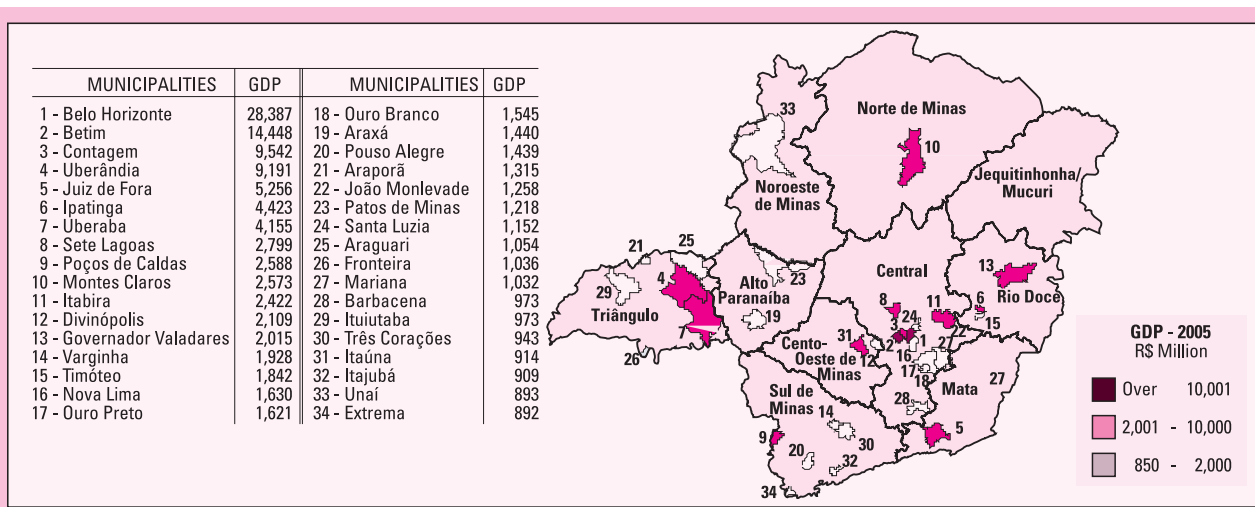

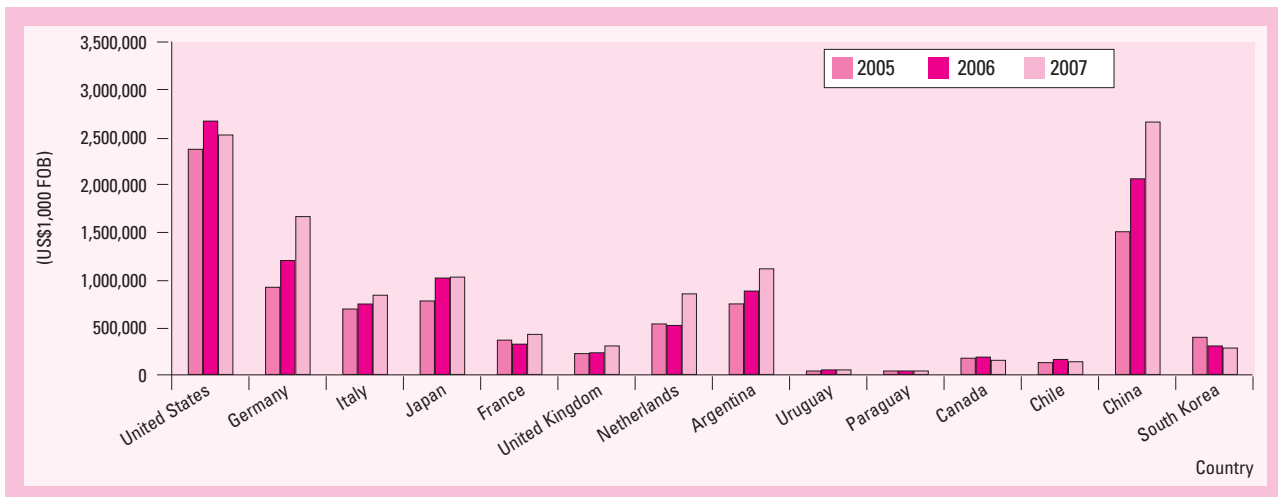

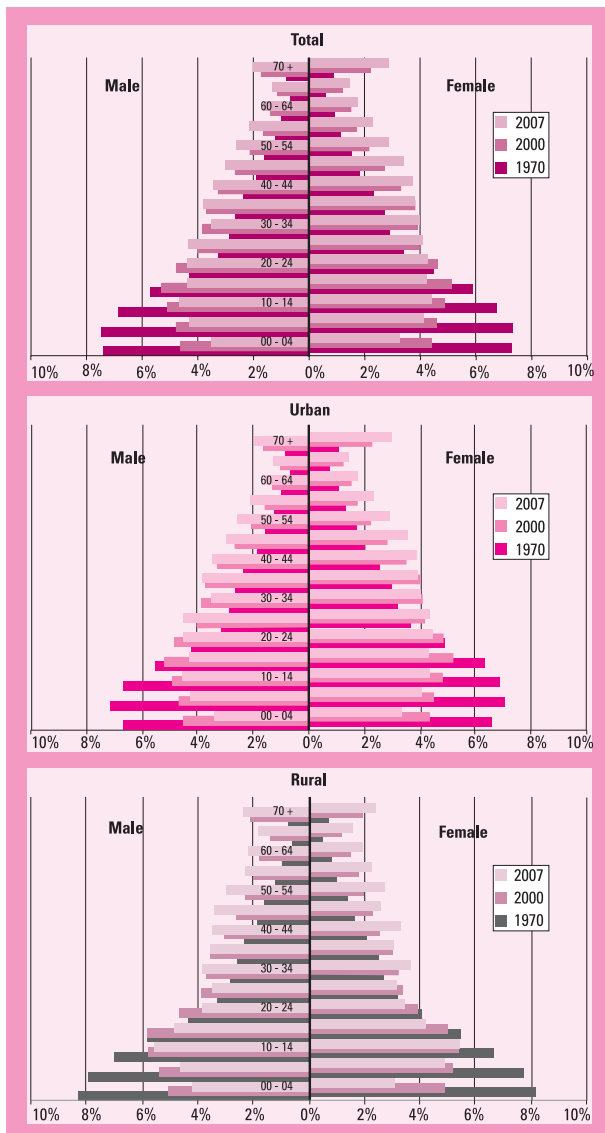

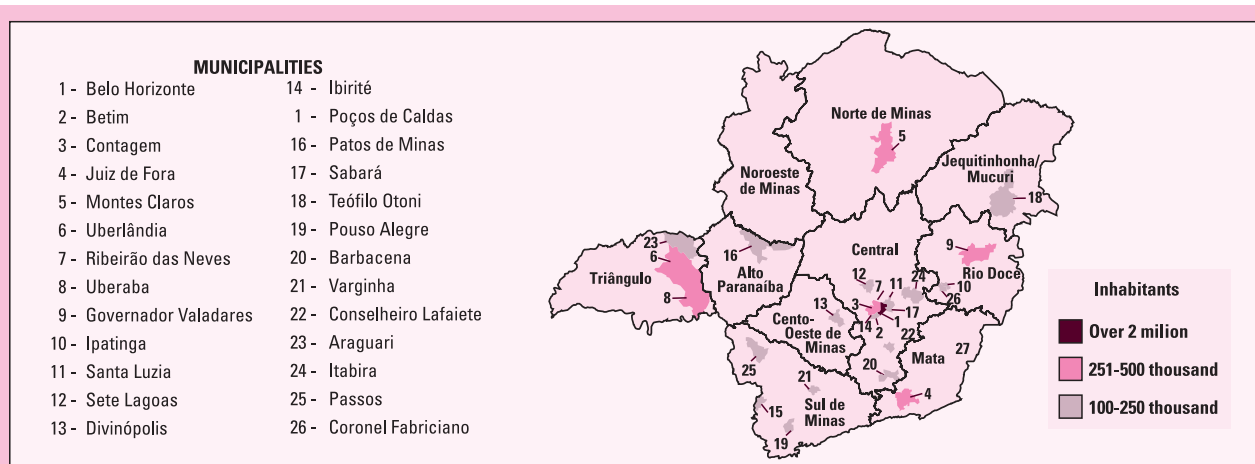

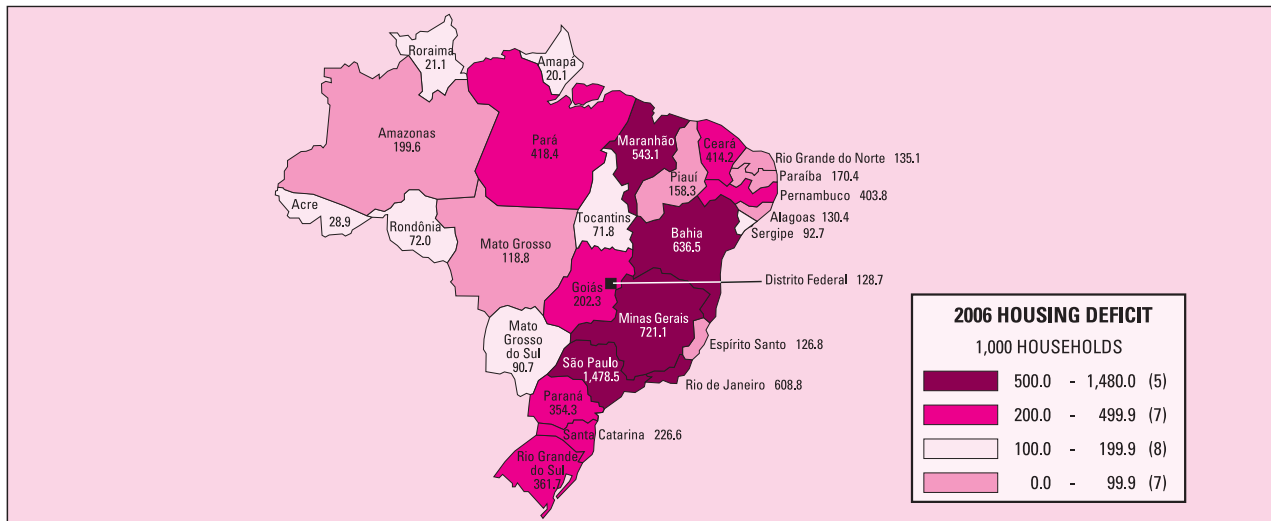

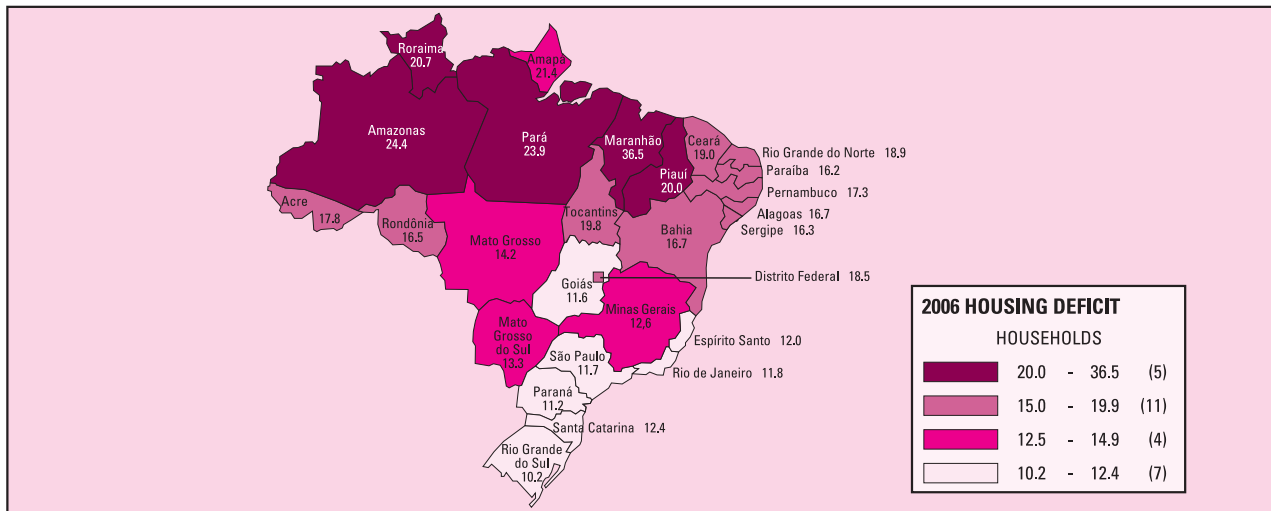

GLOSSARY

B

BIOTA - collectively, the plants, microorganisms and animals of a certain area or region.

BUDGETARY REVENUE - the required resources for investments (expenses) planned by the government resulting from **Current revenue** (taxes, contributions, state-owned assets, agriculture and livestock, industrial activities, services, transfers and other) and from **Capital revenue** (credit operations, sale of assets, loan amortization, transfer and other). It represents the receipts of the state treasury.

C

COFFEE BEANS - raw fruit after harvest and before processing.

CONSUMED ELECTRIC POWER - the multiplication product of capacity (in kW) of installed equipment in consumption units by power consumption (in hours).

CRUDE BIRTH RATE - total live births during a one-year period divided by total population. The rate is expressed per 1,000 inhabitants.

CRUDE DEATH RATE - total number of deaths divided by the total population during a given period of time. The rate is expressed per 1,000 inhabitants.

D

DEPENDENT STATE COMPANY - a state-controlled company that in the previous fiscal year received financial resources from its controller for payroll, general costs or capital costs, except, in the latter case, for those costs derived from any increase in the shareholders' equity, and in whose budget, in the current fiscal year, an authorization is granted for the receipt of resources for the above-mentioned purposes.



E

ECONOMICALLY ACTIVE POPULATION (EAP) (IBGE; Employment & Unemployment Survey) - proportion of working-age population (WAP) consisting of employed or unemployed individuals.

ELECTORAL ABSTENTION - the percentage of the electorate that is legally required to vote but does not.

ELECTORATE - the percentage of the population that is legally eligible to vote. In Brazil, the population age 18 to 60 years is legally required to vote. For individuals age 16 to 18 and 70+, voting is not mandatory.

EMPLOYED PERSONS (IBGE) - individuals who during the survey reference period were working or had a job, but were on vacation, leave of absence, strike, etc.

Employees - individuals who are paid in money or in kind (goods or services) to work for one or more employers.

Autonomous and self-employed persons - individuals who perform an economic activity or are engaged in an occupation or trade, but do not employ others.

Employers - individuals who run a business or are engaged in an occupation with the aid of one or more employees.

Note: Starting in 1992, the National Household Sample Survey (PNAD/IBGE) has also considered those who were involved in the production or construction for self-consumption.

F

FORMAL JOB - administrative registers of the Employed and Unemployed Population General Register (CAGED) of the Ministry of Labor and Employment, concerning the number of jobs with legal employment relationships referring to a paid job, i.e., employment relationships governed by the Consolidation of Labor Laws.

FULL PROTECTION UNITS - designed to keep ecosystem areas inviolate from human interference, being allowed

only the indirect use of its natural properties or attributes, unless otherwise provided by law.

G

GEOGRAPHIC MESOREGION - homogeneous land unit that is larger than a microregion but smaller than a state or territory that results from grouping microregions.

GEOGRAPHIC MICROREGION - a cluster of areas within a state containing municipalities featuring somewhat similar physical, social and economic characteristics.

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT (GDP) - total value of goods and services produced by resident units, that is to say, the total value added by the several sectors, plus taxes less subsidies charged on products not taken into account in the product valuation process. The gross domestic product equals the sum of the final consumption of goods and services produced at market value and the sum of primary incomes as well. Therefore it can be observed from these three frames of reference: GDP - output based, GDP - demand based and GDP - income based.

H

HOUSING DEFICIT - concerns the need to build new dwellings in order to solve social and specific housing-related problems.

I

IGP-DI (General Price Index - Internal Availability) - refers to the weighted average of the Wholesale Price Index (IPA), Consumer Price Index (IPC) and National Construction Cost (INCC), as determined by the Getúlio Vargas Foundation since 1944.

IGP-M (Market General Price Index) - similar to IGP-DI, except for the period of price collection (from the 21st day of the previous month to the 20th day of the reference



month) and for the historic series, which started in 1989 at the request of the business community.

INFANT MORTALITY RATE (per 1,000 live births) - the coefficient that corresponds to the number of deaths of children under one year of age, usually called infant deaths, occurred within a specific period, and the number of live births during the same period of time.

L

LIFE EXPECTANCY AT BIRTH - average number of years an individual is expected to live at birth.

LIMNOLOGY - area of biology concerned with freshwater habitats and ecosystems.

LIVE BIRTH - the complete expulsion or extraction of the conception product from the mother's body, irrespective of the duration of the pregnancy, which after the separation process breathes or shows any vital sign such as heartbeat or umbilical cord pulsation.

M

METROPOLITAN BELT - the municipalities surrounding the metropolitan area that are affected by the urbanization process and participate in the planning, organization and performance of common-interest public functions.

N

NATIONAL HOUSEHOLD SAMPLE SURVEY (PNAD) - conducted on a yearly basis by IBGE, except for Census years, it examines and surveys a wide range of socioeconomic characteristics, either permanent ones like general population characteristics, or variable ones. The maximum disaggregation allowed is by metropolitan area.

NATURAL MONUMENTS - a protection unit responsible for maintaining and protecting natural, rare, unique sites, some of them featuring a breathtaking landscape.

NATURE CONSERVATION UNITS (NCU) - territories and their environmental resources, including coastal waters, having remarkable natural features that are legally established by the public power with clear and specific conservation and boundary goals under a special administration basis and subject to adequate guarantees of protection. They are controlled by IBAMA, a federal agency, and are an integral part of the National System of Nature Conservation Units (NSCU), established on July 18, 2000, pursuant to Law # 9.985.

NOMINAL MONTHLY INCOME (IBGE) - the monthly income deriving from the main job and other work activities the surveyed person carried out during the reference week.

O

OPEN UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (IBGE) - the ratio of unemployed individuals to the Economically Active Population (EAP) during the reference period.

P

PRIVATE NATURAL HERITAGE RESERVE - a private area, registered in perpetuity, focused on the protection of biological diversity.

PRIVATE, PERMANENT HOUSEHOLD - a structurally independent dwelling built for residential purposes and consisting of one or more rooms with a private entrance. It may be used by one, two, or at most five families.

PUBLIC DEBT - securities and contracts that act as a guarantee from the government to creditors who will be compensated for their invested financial resources. Public debt can be classified as: Internal debt (when the creditor lives in the national territory); External debt (when the creditor does not live in the national territory) or Fluctuating debt (a debt incurred by the government on a short-term, fixed basis, owing to temporary financial difficulties and represented by negotiable instruments).

R

REALIZED EXPENSES - refers to public expenses already planned by the government and corresponds to the state treasury's outgoing funds. They consist of: **Current expenses** (operating expenses that have been realized in order to promote the performance, maintenance and funding of government activities; they do not directly contribute to the acquisition of capital goods) and **Capital expenses** (outlays that contribute to the development or acquisition of capital goods or that add value to an already existing asset, as well as to transfer, either by purchase or any other acquisition procedure, the ownership of a good).

RELEVANT ECOLOGICAL INTEREST AREA - usually refers to a small area, with insignificant or no human population, featuring extraordinary natural characteristics or sheltering rare examples of regional plants, animals and microorganisms (biota). In such areas, those activities that may threaten the local or regional natural ecosystems are forbidden, being only allowed the exploitation of natural products that is compatible with the primary goal of nature conservation.

RESIDENT POPULATION - individuals living permanently in the domicile, that is, individuals who had their permanent home in such domiciles, irrespective of being there or not at the time of the Census.

S

SANITARY SEWAGE DISPOSAL - drainage and disposal of water and waste matter from bathrooms or toilets used in private permanent households, classified by type as follows:

General or pluvial sewage system - waste matter is carried away from its sources through sewers; after collection, sewage is conveyed to a local, municipal or regional disposal site, either in the municipality or in the region, irrespective of whether a sewage treatment facility is available or not;

Septic tank - the bathroom plumbing system is connected to a septic tank, i.e., the waste matter is carried

to nearby tank, subjected to treatment or a settling process, and the liquid matter may or may not be carried away to a general local, municipal or regional disposal site;

Other - waste matter is deposited directly into a ditch, in a river, lake or ocean, or by means other than those described above.

STATE FUND - an accounting entity, with non-legal characteristics, established by law and consisting of the product of specific revenues and assets required for the achievement of pre-established objectives or rendering of specific services, as per Article 2 of Complementary State Law # 27 of January 18, 1993.

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT RESERVE - a natural area, home to traditional populations whose existence is associated with sustainable natural resource exploitation systems. Such systems have been developed over many generations and tailored to local ecological conditions, thus playing a paramount role in nature protection and the maintenance of biological diversity.

SUSTAINABLE USE - the use of environmental resources at a rate that ensures the perennity of renewable environmental resources and ecological processes, maintaining the biodiversity and further ecological attributes in a socially fair and economically feasible way.

T

TOTAL FERTILITY RATE - the average number of children born alive to a woman during her reproductive period (49 years of age).

TOTAL UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (Employment & Unemployment Survey) - the ratio of unemployed individuals to EAP, which indicates the percent of the EAP that faces a situation of open or disguised unemployment (See Unemployed Individuals).



TRASH DISPOSAL - trash from private permanent households is classified in accordance with the following types of disposal methods:

Collected - household trash is directly collected either by a public or private service or company, which serves the area where the household is located, or stored in dumpsters, tanks or storage areas assigned by a public or private company for later collection;

Burned (locally) - household trash is burned on the respective property;

Other type of disposal - trash is buried on the property, dumped in a vacant lot, street, river, lake or ocean, or disposed of by means other than those described above.

U

UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS (Employment & Unemployment Survey) – individuals who are in the following situations:

Open unemployment - individuals who effectively sought a job in the 30 days prior to the interview and who did not perform any type of work in the previous 7 days;

Unemployment disguised by precarious work - individuals who work irregularly at a paid job (or people who work unpaid in family businesses) and who looked for a new job in the 30 days prior to the interview, or who, instead of searching for a job during the reference period, had sought employment some time in the previous 12 months;

Unemployment disguised by discouragement - individuals without work and who had not looked for a job in the previous 30 days due to discouraging labor market conditions or causal circumstances, but who had sought employment in the last 12 months.

UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS (IBGE) - unemployed individuals who during the survey reference week effectively looked for a job during the 30-day reference period.

URBAN & RURAL POPULATION:

Urban population - individuals and households located in urbanized and non-urbanized areas of cities (municipal seats), villages (district seats) or isolated urban areas;

Rural population - individuals and households located in any area outside the urban limits, including urban fringe communities, small settlements and nuclei.

V

VALUE ADDED - value added to goods and services consumed during the production process. It is a contribution made by the economic activities to the gross domestic product, being equivalent to the balance between the production value and the intermediary consumption absorbed by the said economic activities.

W**WATER SUPPLY:**

General supply system - water provided from a general supply system that is either piped into the household or, at least, onto the land or property where the household is located:

with indoor plumbing - water is piped into at least one room of the abode;

without indoor plumbing - water is not piped into any room of the abode;

Other supply- a household which uses water from wells, springs, water trucks, rain water collection or any other means not described above.

WORK (IBGE):

Paid economic occupation - an activity performed and paid in money, in kind or other form of monetary remuneration, focused on the production of goods or services;

Unpaid economic occupation - an activity performed for at least one hour per week in the following situations: helping a family member in his/her business, religious institutions, cooperatives or as an apprentice or intern.



WORK INCOME (Employment & Unemployment Survey) - the gross cash income (before income and social security taxes) that is actually earned for work performed during the month immediately before the survey month. For wage earners, account is taken of salary deductions due to unjustified absences and extra pay resulting from overtime work and bonuses, etc. Christmas bonus and fringe benefits are not computed. For employers, self-employed workers and other similar positions, monthly withdrawals are considered.
